- What:** Six mounted lessons with Pony Club National Examiners, and numerous unmounted education sessions on a variety of Horse Management topics.

when the children arrive at the camp grounds. It is the responsibility of the **Evening Chaperone** to get the kids up, fed and to the camp grounds at the time agreed to by their Camp Chaperone. Please be sure to allow sufficient time for the campers to feed their horses, muck their stalls and tack up (if applicable) prior to their first mounted/unmounted lesson. Be sure to coordinate with the Camp Chaperone on arrival times so no children are left unattended.

**NOTE: All campers, chaperones, parents, and siblings MUST wear barn appropriate shoes when in the barn and/or handling the horses.**

You must send a copy of your 2008 Coggins Report, and bring the original with you to Camp (it should always travel with your horse). **If traveling from out of State, you must have your interstate health certificate with you.**

**Lake Shore Region Pony Clubs  
Cancellation Policy**

1. If an entry is withdrawn prior to the closing date, the entry fee will be refunded at 100%
2. After the closing date, if a suitable replacement can be found on the waiting list (same rating/skill level), the entry fee will be refunded less a \$25 office fee. If no suitable replacement can be found from the waiting list, the applicant can find a replacement on their own, but the DC must ensure that the replacement is at the appropriate level. If the replacement is appropriate, the original entrant will receive a refund less a \$25 office fee.
3. If an entrant cancels after the closing date but prior to arrival at the event and no suitable replacement can be found, the entrant will receive a 50% refund.
4. No refunds will be made after arrival to the event.
5. In the case of extreme circumstances (i.e., horse or rider injured) the entrant may appeal to the Regional Board. Appeals will be discussed and voted on at the next Regional Board Meeting.
